#### **OBJECTIVE**

This scholarship is made in memory of our parents, Wilbert C. Carter, Sr. and Jessie J. Carter, who were living examples of the Christian walk and worked tirelessly for the kingdom of God. They were members of and active in Metropolitan Baptist Church for greater than 60 years. The objective of this scholarship is to provide post-secondary support to a graduating high school senior who has excelled academically and contributed his or her talents to the improvement of the community. The scholarship recognizes the impact that financial assistance can have on higher education study and completion.

#### **AWARDS**

The Carter family will award one scholarship in the amount of \$700.00 to an eligible high school senior who will attend an accredited\* college or university. The student must be graduating from a public or charter high school.

### The Sydney Oliver Garth Scholarship for the Arts

The Sydney Oliver Garth Scholarship for the Arts is for students with majors in the visual arts including, but not limited to, architecture, ceramics, drawing, fashion, graphic design, illustration, interior design, painting, photography, sketching, video production and other decorative arts. Established in 2020, the scholarship honors Sydney Garth who wanted to ensure that youth have access to arts and arts education regardless of race or economic status.

Mr. Garth, a long-time member of Metropolitan, dedicated his life to supporting arts and fine arts at Metropolitan and in the Washington D.C. community. Sydney spent many years mentoring and supporting young artists as members of many musical ensembles including the Washington Performing Arts Men and Women of the Gospel Choir, Heritage Choral, Baltimore Community College, the Metropolitan Music Ministry and The Academy. His fine arts mentoring was not limited to music, he also served as the admissions director and mentor at The Art Institute of Washington and manager at Van McCoy Music. Sydney's commitment to the arts will live on through each recipient of the Sydney Oliver Garth Scholarship for the Arts.

#### ABOUT THE SCHOLARSHIP

The Sydney Oliver Garth Scholarship for the Arts offers awardees \$2,000 and the opportunity to showcase your visual arts at the Metropolitan Baptist Church.

#### **PROCEDURES**

- Applicants must be U.S. citizens or a permanent U.S. resident, pursuing a major and career in a visual art, or planning to enroll in the upcoming 2024-2025 academic year as a full-time undergraduate student.
- Applicants must exhibit leadership ability and participation in community service activities.
- A minimum 2.5 GPA is required.
- Applicants must furnish the Committee with proof of exceptional ability in his/her chosen field by submitting:
  - 1. In one document, a personal statement explaining how the scholarship will aid in your development into a professional artist (500-word maximum).
  - 2. Resume detailing your academics, extracurricular activities, honors, employment, community service, and special skills.
  - 3. One letter of recommendation from an art teacher or mentor.
  - 4. An unofficial transcript (all pages, in color, and legible).
  - 5. MOST IMPORTANT A photo of an original piece of artwork from the art genre for which you are applying, with each file name showing the piece's title. While you may submit copies of a number to demonstrate the breadth of your artistic abilities, please indicate which ONE you would like the scholarship committee to judge for the purpose of the scholarship competition.

Servant Virgie departed this life on September 28, 2021, yet our memories of Servant Virgie and her exemplary service still speak loudly as a role model to the Metropolitan family and especially to her fellow Hamptonians at MBC.

Servant Virgie was a star vocalist in the Senior Choir, a founding member of the Questers, a Sunday School Teacher, and a Director of the Lay Ministry. Yet she found the time and summoned the energy to volunteer at the Metropolitan Day School, served as Church Clerk, Church Archivist and founder of the MBC Hampton University Alumni Association.

While much more could be said about Servant Virgie, her example of service, dedication and tireless devotion to her Church and to her Alma Mater stand as a testament to her extraordinary life. ## The Lena Price Smith Scholarship

The Christian Discipleship Council, formerly known as the Board of Christian Education, was founded in 1944 under the leadership of the late Dr. E. C. Smith. Mrs. Lena Price Smith was the first Chairperson of the Board, a post that she held from 1944 to 1976. Under her leadership, the following initiatives were established: Teacher Training Class, The Christian Education Institute, Leadership Training School, and Baptist Youth Fellowship. All high school graduates who will be attending a college or university are eligible to apply for a Lena Price Smith Scholarship. This scholarship is \$750.00.

#### **Requirements:**

- Applicants should submit a copy of a letter of acceptance from the institution of higher learning.
